


### **OASIS+ Goals**

- Federal Acquisition Service (FAS)'s next generation Best-in-Class (BIC) Multiple-Award (MA), Indefinite-Delivery Indefinite-Quantity (IDIQ), Multi-Agency Contract (MAC) program for complex non-IT services-based solutions
- Supports federal agencies' procurement requirements for services-based solutions
- Enables federal customers to acquire innovative solutions from highly qualified businesses on a contract vehicle designed to be BIC
- Provides access to highly qualified contractors of all sizes from multiple industries



### **OASIS+ Draft RFP Feedback**

Over 2,200 questions and 680 survey responses received in response to Draft RFP; currently under review

### NAICS strategy in-line with FAR 19.102(b)(2)(i)

#### OASIS+ Solicitation NAICS

- For admin purposes only, Single NAICS (541990) will be assigned
- Represents the preponderance scope of OASIS+

### OASIS+ Primary NAICS

- Due to limitations with FPDS, only a single NAICS may be reported with each contract action
- For SB contracts: the Primary NAICS assigned will be based on the largest size standard within its awarded Domain(s)
  - Critical to ensure SBs are not locked out of Domain Fair Opportunity during re-representation

See DRFP#2 Section C.1.1, North American Industry Classification System.



### NAICS strategy in-line with FAR 19.102(b)(2)(i)

- OASIS+ Primary NAICS
  - For UR contracts: the Primary NAICS assigned will be based on the smallest size standard within its awarded Domain(s)
  - Critical to ensure OTSB requirements are properly enforced
    - Subcontracting Plans and Reporting
    - Sustainability Reporting

See DRFP#2 Section C.1.1, North American Industry Classification System.



### NAICS strategy in-line with 13 CFR 121.402(c)(1)(ii)

- While the Primary NAICS will be reflected in each contract:
  - Contract Holders' eligibility <u>are not limited</u> to responding to task order RFPs or performing work outside the NAICS assigned to their contract as the Primary NAICS
  - Contract Holders will be eligible to compete within all awarded Domain CLINS
  - Once FPDS is able to accommodate multiple NAICS, a Mass Modification to all awarded contracts will be executed to assign all applicable NAICS within FPDS; however, all awarded NAICS will be included in each awarded contract document

# **OASIS+** Evaluation Strategy - All Highly Qualified Offerors

- Qualifying threshold must be met using a combination of project and corporate-level criteria
  - Majority of credit comes from "Qualifying Projects"
  - Multiple avenues to meet Domain qualification standard
  - Tailored Factors Support Domain's Critical Mission Scope

#### Enterprise Solutions Domain

 Mission critical requirements (\$250M+), criteria targets highly qualified technically capable companies to perform specialized and/or complex services

#### Intelligence Domain

Additional credit for cleared facilities and/or personnel


Market research leads to selecting OASIS+ contract family, then Domain is selected.






### Step 2:

Select Order NAICS from Domain NAICS Choices.




### Step 4:
